

## **CPRE HERTFORDSHIRE AWARDS**

### **Awards for those caring about their community and/or the environment**

*Supported by Hertfordshire County Council and Hertfordshire Life*

**Projects should include one or more of the following. They should:**

- be conceived/fundraised for by the community
- give added value to community life
- have something innovative about them
- be used by all areas and ages of the community
- bring the community together
- provide for continuity
- promote access to the countryside
- celebrate Hertfordshire's landscapes
- enhance the countryside for all to enjoy
- promote local food/food production
- have potential for further development
- be environmentally friendly

**Examples of Projects might be:**

- community-owned/community-run shop or pub
- community-run minibus/taxi service/car pool
- Good Neighbours Scheme, adopt-a-granny
- community-run Festival/Event
- volunteer management of a community hall/community service
- creating footpaths/improving access to existing footpaths
- scheme giving urban dwellers access to the countryside
- photography or art project which celebrates Hertfordshire countryside
- campaign to protect a valued local area from inappropriate development
- volunteer litter-picking group
- pub/restaurant/shop sourcing locally grown foods
- community orchard/playground/garden

**All projects considered should:**

- protect, promote and enhance towns or villages and/or the surrounding countryside to make them better places to live, work, go to school or enjoy for today and tomorrow.

**Special awards:**

These recognise people and businesses which have made an outstanding contribution to improving life in their community or enhancing the environment in Hertfordshire:

Dorothy Abel Smith Award, presented to a young person aged up to 21

Peterkin Award, presented to an adult over 21
