## HELP US TO FIGHT FOR HERTFORDSHIRE'S COUNTRYSIDE

Our members have generously responded to our previous appeals for funds, which has enabled us to fight for our countryside throughout the local plan process, and in particular our input on the public inquiries, the "Examinations in Public" of the plans. However, this work goes on and we have to continue to participate in and respond to these "EiPs", particularly, as has happened, where the inspector has demanded more development and has instituted a "Call for Sites". This is asking landowners and developers to provide more land for development, inevitably often Green Belt.

The process is therefore taking longer than was reasonably expected and we have to continue to have a presence at the extended EiPs to put our case. Unfortunately this will cost a lot of money, we estimate at least £500 a day, providing professional help to back up our hard working in-house team.

With three EiPs coming up in the near future, we think that we need at least £5,000.
