In the Consultation Draft, at paragraph 4.4, under 'Population', the Plan stated that future population levels were based on the 2014 ONS projections. In our representations we stated that those projections were excessive, and the latest (2016- based) population and household projections are much lower, as noted in paragraph 4.4 of the proposed Submission Plan. These significantly reduced numbers are not however reflected in any change to the calculation of future need for sand and gravel extraction in the County.

Paragraphs 4.5 and 4.6 on 'Housing' are also based on excessive assumptions about future housing development in the County. This is because they are based on the emerging Local Plan Housing Targets that have not completed their statutory examinations and been adopted through the Local Plan process, and are being strongly opposed during those examinations. Hence the figure of 90,000 additional dwellings by 2031 is not justified and is not a sound basis for future Minerals Planning in Hertfordshire.
