As stated in our representation on the same paragraph in the Consultation Draft, The figure in paragraph 5.6 under the 'Need for Aggregates', of 1.39 million tonnes per annum (mtpa) to be planned for, was set in 2009, a decade ago, for the period that expires next year. This figure is carried forward in Section 8 (Strategic Aggregates Supply), in paragraph 8.4, as a commitment that Herts is obliged to meet under this out of date apportionment, but this figure is only valid until 2020, and the Plan should be based on future requirements, not forecasts from over a decade ago, or out of date development plan assumptions. CPRE considers that the use of pre-recession, pre-NPPF, and pre-Brexit projections, and the Plans based on them, is unsound and unjustified. This is particularly the case because the figures for future supply (paragraph 8.7) are intended to ensure supply not just for 15 years, but also for a further 7 years, which would mean the use of the now arbitrary provision of 1.39 mtpa, for 31 years, nearly a third of a Century from the date it was originally agreed in 2009.
