Application no. 3/21/2781/FUL

Land east of Pelham sub-station, Maggots End, Manuden Construction and operation of a solar farm. Erection of mounted solar photovoltaic (pv) arrays and battery storage. Erection of inverter cabins, dno substation, customer switchgear, fencing, cctv, landscaping and creation of access.

I write with regard to the above application which has been made to Uttlesford District Council and submitted to yourselves without amendment. I note that the only portion of the application that applies to East Herts District Council is a trench and connection to a proposed Battery Energy Storage System (BESS) facility, for which an application was made to yourselves in April this year under number 3/21/0969/FUL at Greens Farm, East End, Stocking Pelham.

CPRE Hertfordshire objected to the BESS facility on several grounds, including its prematurity on the grounds of its need in advance of a solar energy installation. We were informed, in a rebuttal by the agent for the applicants for the BESS, that the facility was required in any case for operational reasons.

We now see this rebuttal to be at best disingenuous, if not significantly misleading, and this current application has been made for as large an installation as is possible to be determined by a local planning authority for determination. Our objection remains to the BESS and to the wider installation, and we have prepared a policy statement for ground-mounted solar energy installations which I attach to provide you with detailed information on our position, all of which applies to this application.
