Application no. 22/01449/FP Land to the North East side of The High Street, Hinxworth Erection of one detached 4-bed dwelling, detached garage/store room/double carport, creation of vehicular access off High street, parking and landscaping

I write with regard to the above application, to which CPRE Hertfordshire objects for the following reasons.

- 1. The site for this proposed development is designated as Rural Area Beyond the Green Belt in Policy 6 of the adopted North Herts Local Plan (NHLP) and Policy SP5 of the submission NHLP. Adopted Local Plan Policy 6 requires "maintaining the existing countryside and villages and their character" and the Submission Local Plan Policy SP5 notes that the Council "will operate a general policy of restraint in Rural Areas Beyond the Green Belt".
- 2. The Applicant's assertion in the Planning Statement that "the surrounding area is semirural in character comprising predominantly residential development..." is clearly inappropriate. The proposal is for a single isolated building in its own grounds, surrounded by open land on the edge of Hinxworth village.
- 3. The proposal varies minimally from the previous application refused by the Council and presently subject to appeal. CPRE Hertfordshire supports the Council's decision and agrees with the reasons for refusal.
