Land Near Horse & Jockey PH, East of Watling Street, West of Milfield Lane, Caddington Hybrid Planning Application for a Solar Farm (Full) and associated Electric and Hydrogen Vehicle Charging Service Station and Battery Storage (Outline, other than access)

I am writing with regard to the above application which relates to the portion of a larger ground-mounted solar installation which is mainly located on Central Bedfordshire. I attach the submission made by CPRE Bedfordshire with regard to the main part of the proposals (ref. Central Bedfordshire Council application number CB/23/03583), which identifies specific objections which we believe are equally relevant to the portion of the proposal which lies in Hertfordshire as well as the proposed development as a whole.

We support fully the objections of CPRE Bedfordshire to the above planning application. We also reiterate our support for renewable energy sources on rooftops and land which is <u>not</u> designated as protected, such as Green Belt and Areas of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

CPRE Hertfordshire is particularly concerned at any incursion by development into the River Ver valley, which is an endangered chalk stream of international importance. The effective industrialisation of open countryside through the installation of photo voltaic cells, associated equipment and infrastructure has considerable long-lasting impacts on landscape and directly affects the use and enjoyment of public rights of way, wildlife, biodiversity and agricultural use.

Hertfordshire, like Bedfordshire, is presently subject to a proliferation of planning applications for ground-mounted solar installations which are determined individually by the councils concerned. This is leading to increasing impacts on the open countryside and we would urge the Council to take account of the cumulative effects of developer-initiated proposals.

It is not appropriate to use protected open countryside for low intensity development such as energy generation and we urge the Council to refuse this application.
