I write with reference to the above application, to which CPRE Hertfordshire objects for the follow reasons.

- The site lies within the London Metropolitan Green Belt where development is inappropriate according to the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF) unless very special circumstances can be demonstrated to clearly outweigh the harm caused by the proposed development.
- 2. The proposal is for a substantial dwelling well outside the settlement boundary which will have an impact on the openness of the countryside in this location. The Design and Access Statement notes that "the benefits of the scheme, taken as a whole, are sufficiently unique to amount to very special circumstances". No further issues relating to the proposed development are identified and we request that the Council refuses permission for this inappropriate development.
