Application no. 5/2024/2093 Land adjacent 38 House Lane, Sandridge Permission in principle – development of up to two dwellings

I write with regard to the above planning application for development to which CPRE Hertfordshire objects for the following reasons.

- 1. The site is located in the London Metropolitan Green Belt as defined in the adopted St Albans District Plan Review where development is inappropriate unless very special circumstances can be demonstrated as required by the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). The land is not allocated for housing in either the adopted District Plan Review or the emerging Local Plan which has been submitted for Examination in Public, nor the Sandridge Neighbourhood Plan.
- 2. The site lies outside the settlement boundary of Sandridge and as such constitutes encroachment into open countryside and an extension of the built-up area. The Planning Statement asserts that the proposed development should be regarded as "infill" which is very clearly not the case, with existing development on only one side of the site and bounded by agricultural land.
- 3. It is misleading to suggest that the proposed development "would be seamlessly integrated into the existing village..." when it constitutes two separate houses in their own plots. There is also no basis for asserting that the site is grey belt according to the general criteria identified in the NPPF.
- 4. CPRE Hertfordshire notes and supports the representations of Sandridge Parish Council and local residents with regard to the local conditions and we request that the Council refuses permission for this inappropriate and speculative proposal.
