Planning application no. 6/2024/1368/FULL Parcel D, Digswell Park Road, Hertford Road, Digswell, AL6 0DB Erection of a new dwelling and formation of a new access road

I write with regard to the above planning application to which CPRE Hertfordshire objects strongly for the following reasons.

- The land identified for this proposed development is designated as London Metropolitan Green Belt in the adopted Welwyn Hatfield Local Plan where development is inappropriate unless very special circumstances are identified which clearly outweigh the harms caused, according to criteria in the National Planning Policy Framework (NPPF). No such circumstances have been identified which would clearly outweigh the harm that would be done to the Green Belt by this proposal.
- 2. We note that no Planning Statement has been submitted to accompany this application and believe this is a serious omission due to the undoubted significance of the planning issues which affect this application. The site is subject to an Article 4 Direction to prevent unauthorised development of an area which has been sub-divided into plots where any development would be greatly detrimental to the character of the Green Belt in this area.
- 3. We believe that this application is an egregious intrusion into high quality Green Belt land which is identified as significant in both landscape and heritage terms by the submitted Welwyn Neighbourhood Plan. The site is identified as part of Local Green Space within the proposed River Mimran Blue-Green Corridor and has considerable historical importance as part of parkland laid out in the 18th century by "Capability Brown".

CPRE is working nationally and locally for a beautiful and living countryside



4. CPRE Hertfordshire supports fully the responses of Welwyn Parish Council, the Joint Committee of National Amenity Associations, Hertfordshire County Council Highways and the widely expressed views of local residents regarding the impact on local surroundings, landscape and heritage assets. We urge the Council to refuse permission for this highly inappropriate development.
