Planning application no. 25/0590/FUL

Land to the North of Toms Lane, Toms Lane, Kings Langley

Change of use to create 4 gypsy and traveller pitches including 2 amenity buildings and associated hardstanding and access.

I write with regard to the above planning application to which CPRE Hertfordshire objects for the following reasons.

- The proposed site is designated in the adopted Three Rivers Core Strategy as London
 Metropolitan Green Belt where development is inappropriate unless very special circumstances
 are identified which clearly outweigh the harms caused, according to criteria in the National
 Planning Policy Framework (NPPF).
- 2. The site is a crucial gap between the settlements of Bedmond and Kings Langley contributing to two reasons for Green Belt designation; that is the prevention of sprawl and the coalescence of settlements. It is not appropriate to cite grey belt criteria for a site where a planning appeal was dismissed in 2023 for Green Belt reasons.
- 3. We note that the application title states "change of use" but in fact the application is for the development of traveller pitches affecting one of the last remaining open areas between Bedmond and Kings Langley, with particular impact on the rural character of the immediate area. A change of use such as that proposed would put no effective limit on the number of caravan units which may be located on the site and this may lead to further deterioration of local environmental conditions.
- 4. CPRE Hertfordshire supports fully the concerns and objections of Abbots Langley Parish Council and urges the Council to refuse permission for this incorrectly titled application and inappropriate development.
